

## **Elements Common to All Action Alternatives**

The following elements would be common to all of the action alternatives (Alternatives B - E, and F, the Preferred Alternative):



- Dog walking would be allowed only in areas designated for either on-leash or regulated off-leash (ROLA)\* dog walking.
- ROLAs may be closed periodically to allow re-growth of vegetation.
- All dogs must be licensed in county of residence.



- Maximum number of dogs per dog walker is three, unless permits are allowed.
- No off-trail dog walking; no dogs in campgrounds or public buildings; on-leash in parking lots, picnic areas and on paved, public roads unless otherwise noted.



- Service animals accompanying a person with a disability, as defined by Federal law and Department of Justice regulations
  (Title 28 Code of Federal Regulations 36.104), are allowed wherever visitors or employees are allowed.
- Monitoring management strategy.
- \* The concept of a ROLA, a defined area where off-leash dog walking is allowed under specific guidelines, came from discussions in the Negotiated Rulemaking Committee for Dog Management at GGNRA.
