



Frequently Asked Questions

The National Park Service received additional comments following the December 16, 2025 public meeting at Salt Pond Visitor Center regarding the proposed Cable Road Multi-Use Path. This FAQ summarizes those comments and provides revised responses to frequently asked questions.

Key themes included safety considerations, accessibility to Nauset Light concerns, community support, and technical questions about construction. Feedback also addressed connectivity, utility infrastructure, and long-term planning.

1. How will e-bike use be managed?

- E-Bikes are allowed in Cape Cod National Seashore where traditional bicycles are allowed. Using the electric motor to move an e-bike without peddling is prohibited, except where use of motor vehicles by the public is allowed.

2. What was the community response to the project?

- Many visitors voiced strong support for the project.
- Feedback highlighted improved safety and enjoyment for cyclists and pedestrians.

3. How will utility pole issues be addressed?

- The park has begun and will continue coordination with utility providers including Eversource to ensure proper siting and adequate clearance for vehicles.

4. What about providing safe path crossings at existing streets?

- Where the path crosses streets and driveways, safety measures will be implemented including adding truncated domes, striping, path material changes, and signage where appropriate.
- No driveways or existing streets will be realigned as part of this project.

5. Will accessibility at Nauset Light be maintained?

- Access to Nauset Light will not be changed as part of this project. All existing access routes will remain unless a safety issue is identified.
- Group visits will continue to be accommodated where possible.

6. Does this project allow for future connectivity?

- This project is designed with flexibility for the future. Nothing in the current plan prevents connections to regional paths, and the park will continue to explore opportunities to enhance connectivity over time.
- Suggestions from stakeholders included connecting the path to regional bike trails and reviewing signage for pedestrian and bicycle zones.

- Currently, we are in the planning and preliminary design phases of the project. We estimate that construction would begin in 2027. Construction is anticipated to last approximately 8 months.
