Re: Development of a Programmatic Agreement in Conjunction with the Golden Gate National Recreation Area General Management Plan

Dear Chairman Sarris:

We are continuing Section 106 consultation with your Tribe in conjunction with the completion of the park's proposed General Management Plan (GMP). In a letter dated April 23, 2013, we notified you of our finding that the GMP may result in adverse effects, and invited further consultation and involvement as we move forward with preparation of a Programmatic Agreement (PA), consistent with the provisions of 36 CFR Part 800. The intent of the PA is to provide a framework for future consultations associated with undertakings described in the GMP.

Enclosed is a draft PA for your review and consideration. In addition to satisfying the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), the draft PA is intended to serve as a supplement to the National Park Service (NPS) Nationwide Programmatic Agreement (enclosed), which NPS executed in 2008. We greatly value your Tribe's participation and input early during the development phase of the proposed agreement. To that end, we respectfully request a response within 30 days indicating if your Tribe is interested in entering into the proposed PA as a concurring party. Additionally, we request any comments or revisions that your Tribe may have. Please provide this response to:
