



Existing Natural and Cultural Resources




Wildlife is common on the heavily wooded Tremont Site



The wastewater treatment ponds provide turtle and frog breeding habitat



A wide variety of native plants occur on the Tremont site



Several small streams drain the Tremont site



The Middle Prong of the Little River harbors 24 species of fish, a rich benthic invertebrate fauna, and rare amphibians such as the hellbender, a large salamander



Tremont has restored native field habitat near the entrance to the Institute



The primary viewshed lies along the main axis of the site, looking south



A small but well developed emergent wetland occurs near the south end of the south parking lot



Cultural resources include Girl Scout camp tent platforms, a cemetery, and a water dam on the hill behind the dining hall
