I am pleased to announce the start of a public planning effort to provide input for the development of a National Park Service policy for the use of the structures in Cape Lookout Village National Historic District.

There are a number of structures in the Village which are historically important due to commercial fishing activities, early development of the Coast Guard, recreation use and defense use during WW II. Many uses may be appropriate for these structures. All uses must support the specific mission of Cape Lookout National Seashore as well as the mission of the National Park Service to preserve and protect all park resources for future generations.

I invite your participation in this planning effort. There will be several opportunities to contribute your ideas and concerns about the historic district. Our first workshop, Saturday, April 24th, will begin with an overview of the various issues to be addressed, policies guiding National Park Service actions and goals to be achieved, and then it will move into a “brainstorming” session where we hope many good ideas for the village structures will be expressed.

The mission of Cape Lookout National Seashore is to conserve and preserve for the future the outstanding natural resources of a dynamic coastal barrier island system; to protect and interpret the significant cultural resources of the past and contemporary maritime history; to provide for public education and enrichment through proactive interpretation and scientific study; and to provide for sustainable use of recreation resources and opportunities.

A Public Planning Effort:
