Backcountry Management Plan Purpose and Need

Purpose

To establish a management framework that allows the public to experience Grand Canyon's unique backcountry and wilderness areas while protecting resources and values. The plan will provide direction for management of over 1.1 million acres (or 96% of the park) of primitive, undeveloped park areas, most of which are proposed for wilderness designation.

Need To address backcountry issues and opportunities in the context of Grand Canyon's enabling legislation, the Wilderness Act, NPS Management Policies, the park's 1995 General Management Plan, and update the 1988 Backcountry Management Plan. Since 1988, amount and types of backcountry use have changed, impacts to resources and visitor experiences have occurred, and interim policies have been developed as needed.
