MONONGAHELA NATIONAL FOREST

- 919,000 acres in the north central highlands of West Virginia
- One of the most biologically diverse national forests in the country
- Contains the headwaters of six major river systems
 - 95% of West Virginia's coldwater fisheries
- This National Forest provides:
 - A wide range of recreational opportunities
 - Wilderness areas
 - Timber, water, grazing, and minerals
 - Habitat for wildlife
 - Federally-listed threatened and endangered species
 - Unique ecological areas
- Approximately 1.1 million visits to Monongahela National Forest sites in 2006
