


# Mount Rainier National Park




## Wilderness and Historic Designations



- 97% of the park is designated wilderness
- National Historic Landmark designation in 1997


## Wildlife and Fish at the Park

- 56 mammals (4 federally endangered species: wolverine, Canada lynx, gray wolf habitat, grizzly bear habitat)
- Over 229 species of birds (federally threatened species include the marbled murrelet and northern spotted owl)
- 14 amphibians
- 6 reptiles
- 15 confirmed species of fish
- Unknown number and wide variety of invertebrates



## Park Attributes, Recreation and Trip Objectives for Park Visitors

### Important Attributes to Visitors:



### Recreational Use:

- Annual visitation: ~1.8 to 2.0 million people/year
- Overnight use: ~240,000 people/year
- Climbing: ~13,000 people/year
- Backpacking: ~20,000 people/year
