This letter is in response to a communication dated November 4, 2011, received in our offices November 15, 2011 regarding the request for comments on the Programmatic Agreement (PA) - Rehabilitation of the Historic Chief Petty Officer Bungalows on Ford Island, WWII Valor in the Pacific National Historic Monument.

Built in the 1920's as housing for Ford Island Naval Station personnel, in 2008 the bungalows were included in the World War II Valor in the Pacific National Monument under the management of the National Park Service. Currently the bungalows are vacant but plans for their use – either as a visitor center, for administration purposes, or a combination of the two - is being evaluated. A PA has been prepared because the proposed project will be phased over a number of years and the specific details of the project have yet to be determined.

After a review of the project, the information available on the NPS website, and the *Evaluation of Historic Structures*....(Mason Architects, 2011), **SHPD has no comments on the Programmatic Agreement and looks forward to future consultations as the project takes shape.**
