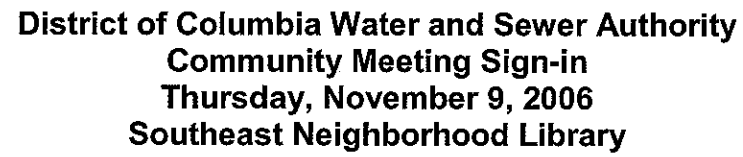

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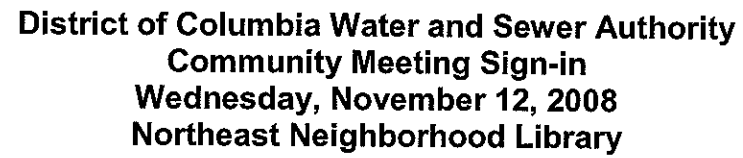
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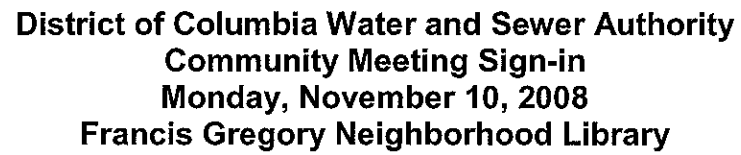

Subject: CSO Public Meeting 2 – ANC/Community Organization Outreach

Purpose of Outreach

DP Consultants initiated scheduling to Advisory Neighborhood Commissions and other community stakeholders south of RFK Stadium in order to inform about and gather additional questions and comments for the Anacostia River Project Combined Sewer Overflow (ARP CSO) project's Environmental Assessment document, which will be released in Spring 2010.

Groups south of RFK Stadium were targeted because they will be impacted most immediately in the first phase of the construction.

Meeting Logistics

Organizations were identified by their proximity within or near the Contract Divisions south of RFK Stadium. Generally taking at least three attempts, presentation scheduling requests for the organizations were sent by email and fax and communicated by telephone.

Preparation for the community meetings required coordination with the ARP CSO Project Consultant Organization and DC WASA's Office of Public Affairs, development and printing of a general fact sheet with project map, and ensuring presentation boards of the overall project and specific Contract Divisions were available.

DC WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY PROJECTS TO CONTROL COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOWS TO THE ANACOSTIA RIVER

The District of Columbia Water and Sewer Authority (DC WASA or Authority) is implementing a Long Term Control Plan (LTCP) to control combined sewer overflows (CSOs) to the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers and Rock Creek. The LTCP is being implemented under a Federal Consent Decree between the United States, the District of Columbia and the Authority. Projects to control CSOs to the Anacostia River are at the top of the Federal Court ordered schedule and the Authority is now preparing final designs and construction documents for these projects. Previous planning for the LTCP established the locations of facilities and included significant public participation involving government and private agencies, environmental interests, neighborhood groups and the general public.

At this point in the program, the Authority is preparing an Environmental Assessment Document (EA) for Anacostia River CSO Control Projects located between the Authority's advanced wastewater treatment plant at Blue Plains (5000 Overlook Avenue, S.W.) and RFK Stadium. The locations of projects included in the EA are shown on Attachment 1. The purpose of the EA is to document previous planning and local environmental effects that may result from the construction of the facilities together with temporary and permanent mitigation measures that may be necessary to incorporate the CSO control facilities into the existing combined sewer system. Additionally, the EA will serve to provide any agency information that the agency may require to authorize the construction of the CSO control facilities on lands under the agency's jurisdiction.

In keeping with established practices to inform the public about activities necessary to implement the LTCP, the Authority is conducting a construction related public participation program to provide the public the opportunity to assist in defining, prioritizing and conveying stakeholder and community interests by way of oral and written comments. Two public meetings are planned as part of the participation program. The first meeting, held on **Thursday, September 17, 2009, 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at Washington Highlands Library, 115 Atlantic Avenue, SW, Washington, DC**, addressed previous planning, the planned construction and measures being considered to mitigate construction impacts. At this meeting, interested community members, agencies and the general public had an opportunity to receive project information as well as review the street level project mapping and its associated environmental effects.

The second meeting, to be held next spring, will address comments received from the first meeting which will have been evaluated to refine the design of the proposed projects. There will be an opportunity to provide written and oral comments which will be officially documented. Public attendance and participation in this process is welcomed and encouraged. 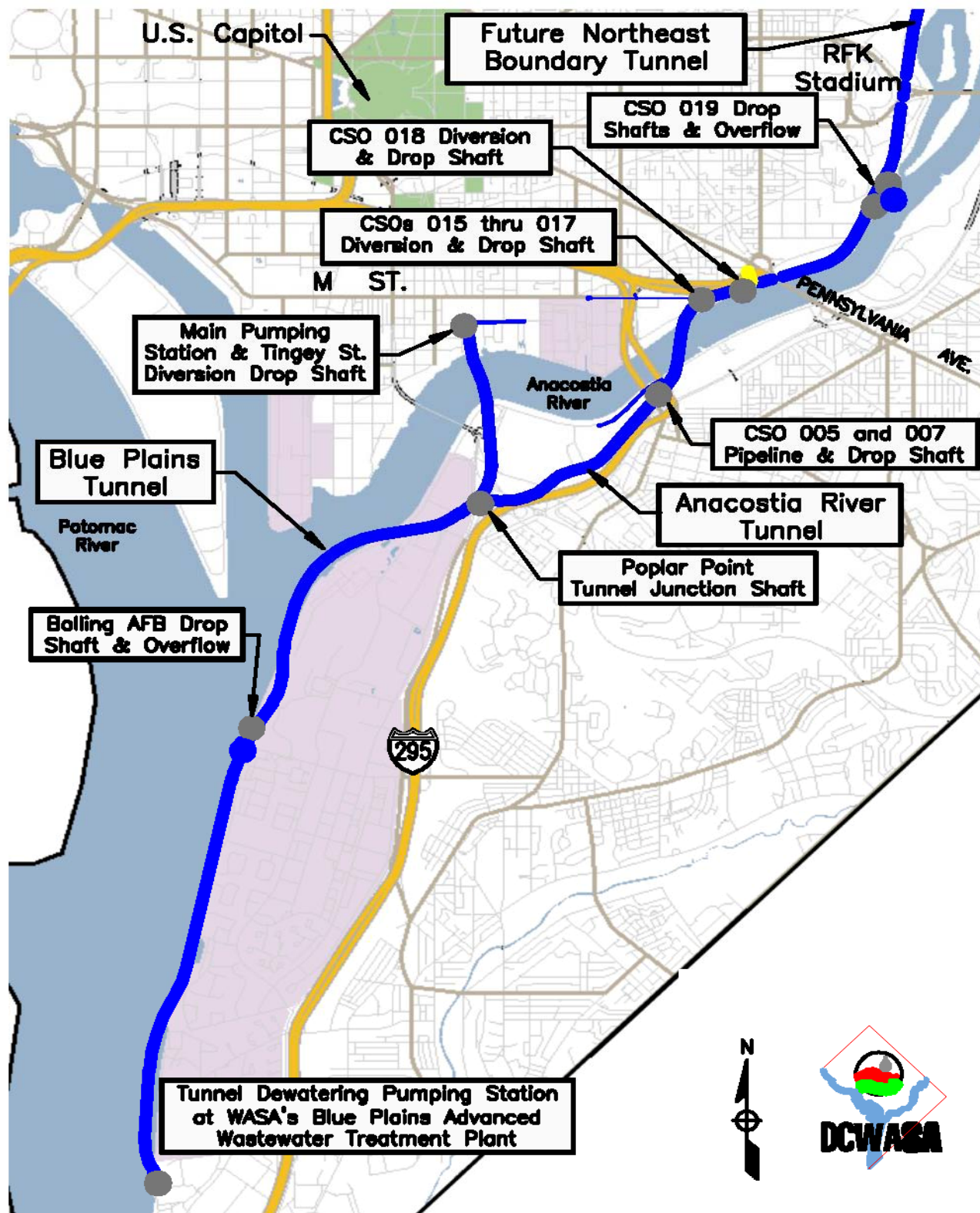

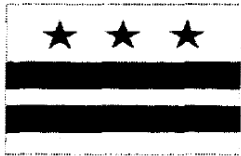

Purpose of Outreach

DP Consultants initiated scheduling to Advisory Neighborhood Commissions and other community stakeholders south of RFK Stadium in order to inform about and gather additional questions and comments for the Anacostia River Project Combined Sewer Overflow (ARP CSO) project's Environmental Assessment document, which will be released in Spring 2010.

Groups south of RFK Stadium were targeted because they will be impacted most immediately in the first phase of the construction.

Meeting Logistics

DC WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY PROJECTS TO CONTROL COMBINED SEWER OVERFLOWS TO THE ANACOSTIA RIVER

The District of Columbia Water and Sewer Authority (DC WASA or Authority) is implementing a Long Term Control Plan (LTCP) to control combined sewer overflows (CSOs) to the Anacostia and Potomac Rivers and Rock Creek. The LTCP is being implemented under a Federal Consent Decree between the United States, the District of Columbia and the Authority. Projects to control CSOs to the Anacostia River are at the top of the Federal Court ordered schedule and the Authority is now preparing final designs and construction documents for these projects. Previous planning for the LTCP established the locations of facilities and included significant public participation involving government and private agencies, environmental interests, neighborhood groups and the general public.

At this point in the program, the Authority is preparing an Environmental Assessment Document (EA) for Anacostia River CSO Control Projects located between the Authority's advanced wastewater treatment plant at Blue Plains (5000 Overlook Avenue, S.W.) and RFK Stadium. The locations of projects included in the EA are shown on Attachment 1. The purpose of the EA is to document previous planning and local environmental effects that may result from the construction of the facilities together with temporary and permanent mitigation measures that may be necessary to incorporate the CSO control facilities into the existing combined sewer system. Additionally, the EA will serve to provide any agency information that the agency may require to authorize the construction of the CSO control facilities on lands under the agency's jurisdiction.

In keeping with established practices to inform the public about activities necessary to implement the LTCP, the Authority is conducting a construction related public participation program to provide the public the opportunity to assist in defining, prioritizing and conveying stakeholder and community interests by way of oral and written comments. Two public meetings are planned as part of the participation program. The first meeting, held on **Thursday, September 17, 2009, 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at Washington Highlands Library, 115 Atlantic Avenue, SW, Washington, DC**, addressed previous planning, the planned construction and measures being considered to mitigate construction impacts. At this meeting, interested community members, agencies and the general public had an opportunity to receive project information as well as review the street level project mapping and its associated environmental effects.

The second meeting, to be held next spring, will address comments received from the first meeting which will have been evaluated to refine the design of the proposed projects. There will be an opportunity to provide written and oral comments which will be officially documented. Public attendance and participation in this process is welcomed and encouraged. 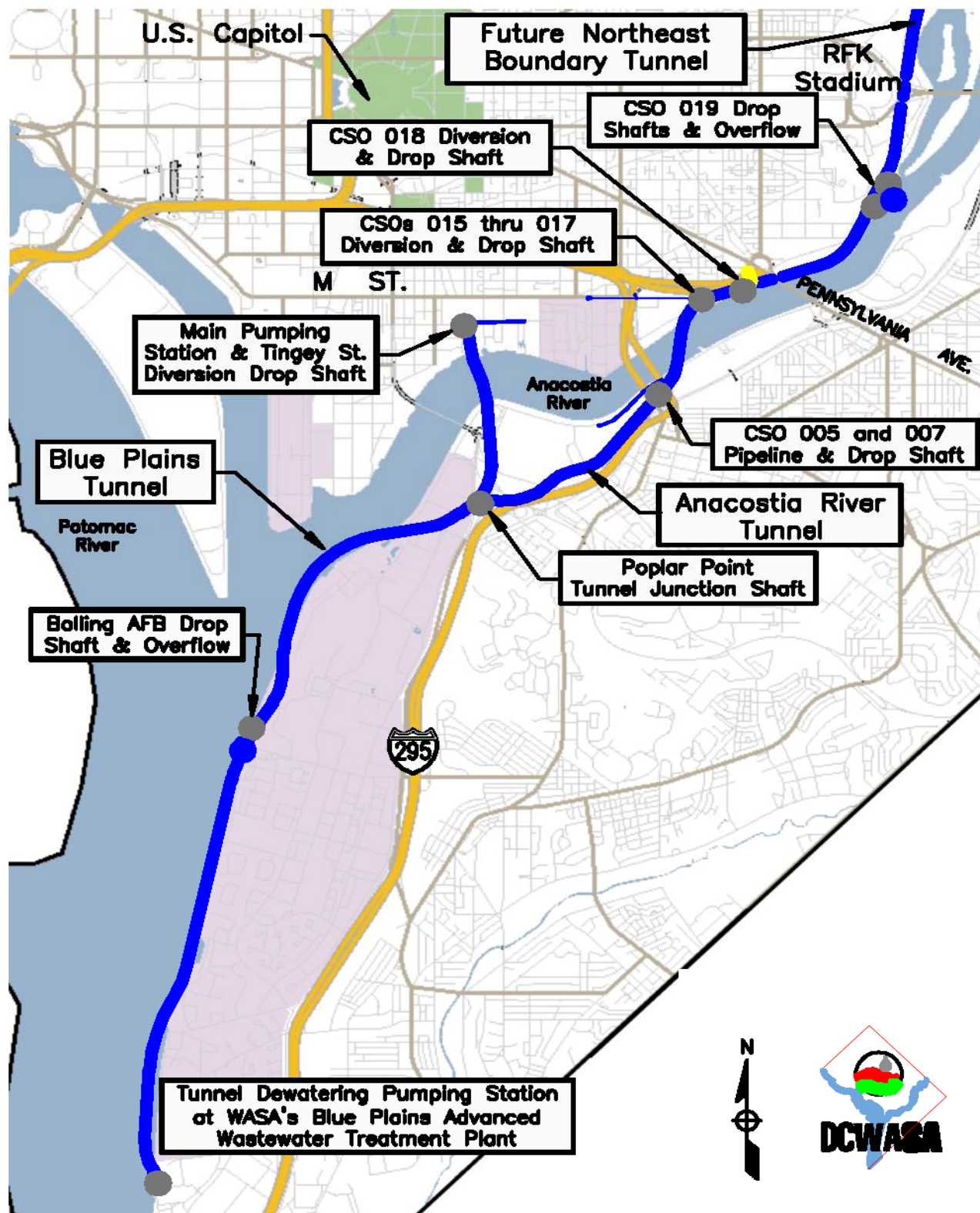
