**Mitigation Measures for the
Proposed Installation of Substitute Material Shingles
on CCC-era Buildings at
Prince William Forest Park
Triangle, Virginia**

Prince William Forest Park, a unit of the National Park Service (NPS), plans to carry out the “Installation of Substitute Material Shingle on Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC)-era Structures” project. The NPS is in consultation with the Virginia State Historic Preservation Office in developing a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) to resolve the adverse effects of this project. The NPS proposes that the following measures be carried out:

I. INTERPRETIVE PANELS

The NPS will prepare an interpretive panel highlighting efforts of historic preservation and sustainability at the park. These panels will be placed in each of the five Cabin Camps and at the park Visitor Center. Within one (1) year of the execution of this Agreement, the NPS shall submit a draft of the exhibit text, images, and other materials to the SHPO and other consulting parties for review and comment. All comments received within the thirty (30) day comment period will be taken into consideration by the NPS into preparing the final wayside exhibit. The NPS shall notify the SHPO and the other consulting parties of the installation within forty-five (45) days of installation.

II. ONLINE INTERPRETIVE MATERIALS

The NPS will create interpretive material on the project to display on the park website to highlight the intersection of historic preservation and sustainability. In addition, the NPS will conduct interpretive tours and talks on these themes when feasible.

III. BUILDING RESTORATION AT CABIN CAMP 3

The NPS will complete a full restoration of a cabin located in Cabin Camp 3. The cabin will undergo a complete restoration. The restoration will include the installation of authentic cedar shake shingles as roofing material. The NPS will make the cabin accessible for visitors to view year round. This will occur as funding becomes available.

IV. DOCUMENTATION OF HISTORIC BUILDINGS AT CABIN CAMP 1

NPS Heritage Documentation Programs (HDP) shall prepare measured drawings, written history, and large format photography for historic structures in Cabin Camp 1. These documents will be kept on file at Prince William Forest Park, the National Capital Regional Office, and the Virginia State Historic Preservation Office.
