*Concept Alternatives are various proposed design options for the canal landscape developed by the project team to meet the purpose and need of the project. These concept alternatives, such as design approaches for accessibility, safety and visitor amenities, have varying levels of effects or impacts to the park and different benefits to achieving the project's goals.

Since we last met...

- The project team has developed a draft Area of Potential Effect (APE) and identified historic resources within the APE (see map on opposite page).
- Historic districts within the draft APE were also identified (see map on opposite page).
- The project team has reviewed feedback received at the last public meeting and revised and refined concept alternatives to reflect public input.

Next Steps:

- The project team will refine the concept alternatives based on feedback received during this comment period which ends May 11, 2019.
- The Environmental Assessment and Section 106 Assessment of Effects Report will be drafted to evaluate impacts to the environment and cultural resources.
- The project team will continue to engage with the consulting parties to avoid, minimize, and mitigate impacts.


