



No Change from Current Conditions

Currently, the park provides opportunities for primarily non-motorized recreation on entrance area trails and the unplowed park road, as well as access to the wilderness.

The shoulder seasons receive the greatest visitation from independent travelers and Alaskans, but summer tour buses accommodating mainly package tour groups operate relatively early in the spring and late in the fall.

With no changes from current conditions, the park strives to maintain things as they are at present, and reacts to increasing and diversifying visitation only when necessary.

Winter Road Plowing

Road Access

- Winter: Non-motorized recreation
- Shoulder seasons
 - Primarily private vehicles
 - Summer tour buses can essentially start and end as soon as the road can safely accommodate them

Visitor Facilities

- Visitor center = Upgrades to MSLC utilities when necessary, continued use of the Murie Dining Hall as secondary visitor space and indoor picnic area
- Other warm spaces for visitors are generally not available and / or not advertised
- No public use shelters

Trails

- Existing frontcountry trails in the entrance area are advertised but not groomed
- The park may decide, but is not obligated, to continue grooming the McKinley Station–Riley campground loop
- Park aufeis monitoring efforts may continue to informally provide a semi-maintained snow surface for non-motorized recreation on the park road
