

ADDENDUM

SUPERINTENDENT'S COMPENDIUM

DENALI NATIONAL PARK AND PRESERVE

This provision supersedes previously issued requirements regarding use of face masks to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

36 CFR 13.50, Closures and restrictions, National Park System Units in Alaska

Mask Wearing Requirements

All individuals over the age of two, regardless of vaccination status, must wear masks, except when actively eating or drinking, in the following locations:

- All common areas and shared workspaces in buildings owned, rented or leased by the National Park Service, including, but not limited to, park visitor centers, administrative offices, lodges, gift shops and restaurants.

All individuals over the age of two who are not yet fully vaccinated must wear masks, except when actively eating or drinking, where the superintendent has determined that physical distancing (staying at least six feet apart) cannot be reasonably maintained such as:

- The Frontcountry Developed Area, as defined in 36 CFR 13.970, when physical distancing is not possible.

Masks must cover the nose and mouth and fit snugly around the nose and chin with no large gaps around the sides of the face. Masks not designed to be protective, masks with ventilation valves, and face shields do not meet the requirement.

Regardless of vaccination status, all individuals must comply with all orders regarding masks issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

CDC prevention measures continue to apply to all travelers on public transit, regardless of vaccination status. Masks remain required on all forms of public transit that operate within parks, including buses, trains, and boats/ferries, and in transportation hubs.

This provision is approved and will remain in effect until rescinded or superseded.
