### **Purpose and Need**

#### **Purpose:**

 The purpose of the Site Development Plan is to identify an overall direction for park management by clearly defining specific resource conditions and the desired visitor experience.

### Need:

- Peak visitation periods exceed the park's carrying capacity, which creates a need to balance the different types of visitor use (recreation, permitted picnicking, interpretation) with resource protection.
- Recent discovery of the site's rich history has created expanded opportunities and a demand by the public for additional interpretation.
- Changes in current park uses and expanded interpretation has created a need for changes to existing facilities and/or the addition of new facilities.



# **Project Overview:**

- Fort Hunt Park is a 105-acre area administered by George Washington Memorial Parkway in Fairfax County, Virginia.
- Existing facilities at the park include five picnic areas, pavilions, a loop road, trails, ball fields, a playground, a volleyball court, a maintenance yard, restrooms, and Park Police stables.
- Historic structures include four Spanish-American War Era Gun Batteries, a Battery Commander's Station, and a Non-Commissioned Officer's (NCO) quarters.
- The Fort Hunt Park Site Development Plan will be a plan for how the National Park Service will manage resources and provide visitor experiences at Fort Hunt Park.





### Elements of the plan could include:


- Locating a site for a new visitor center




