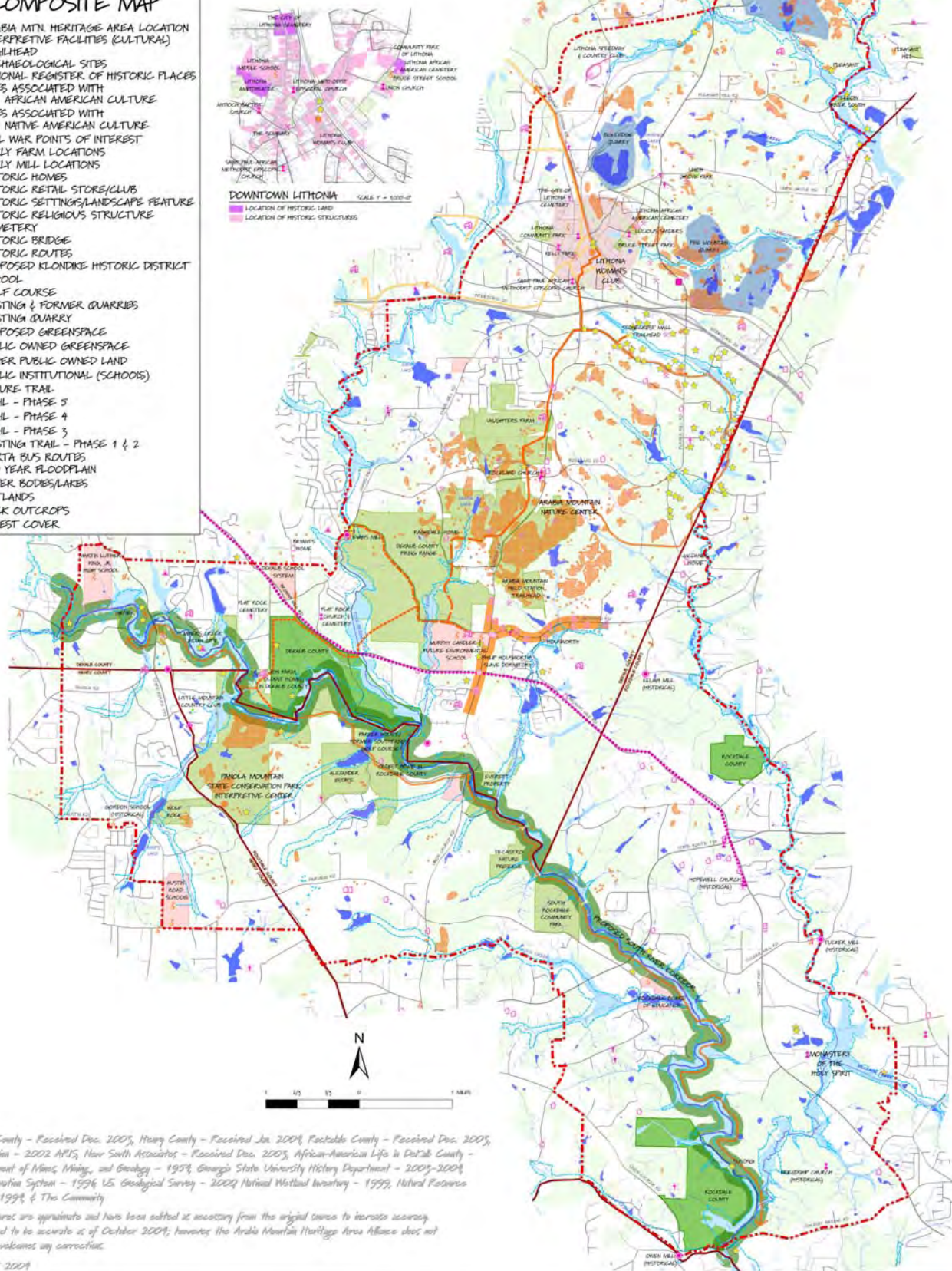

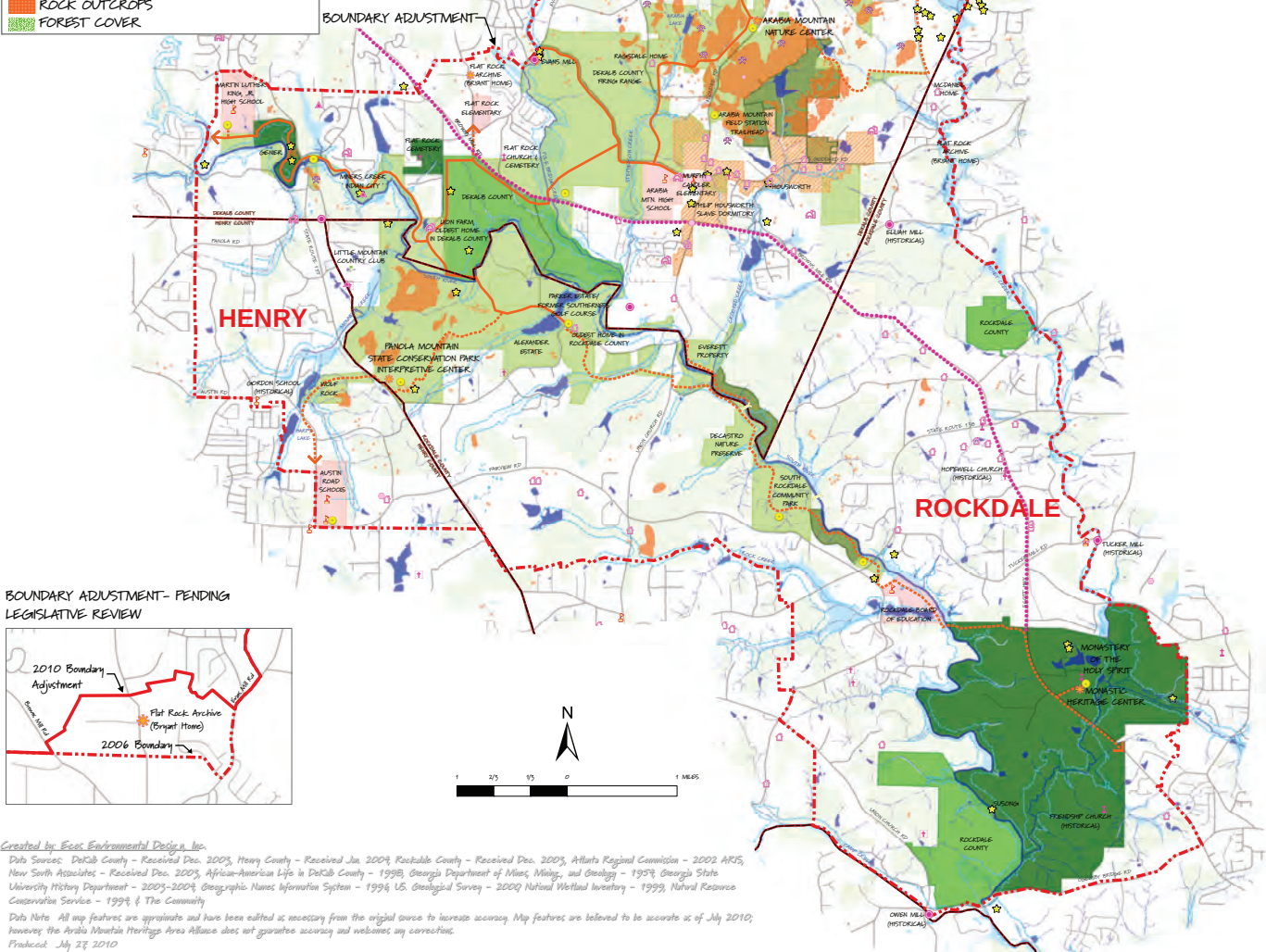

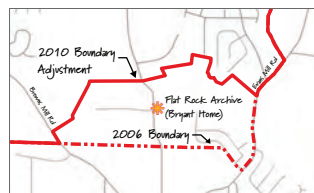


DOWNTOWN LITHONIA

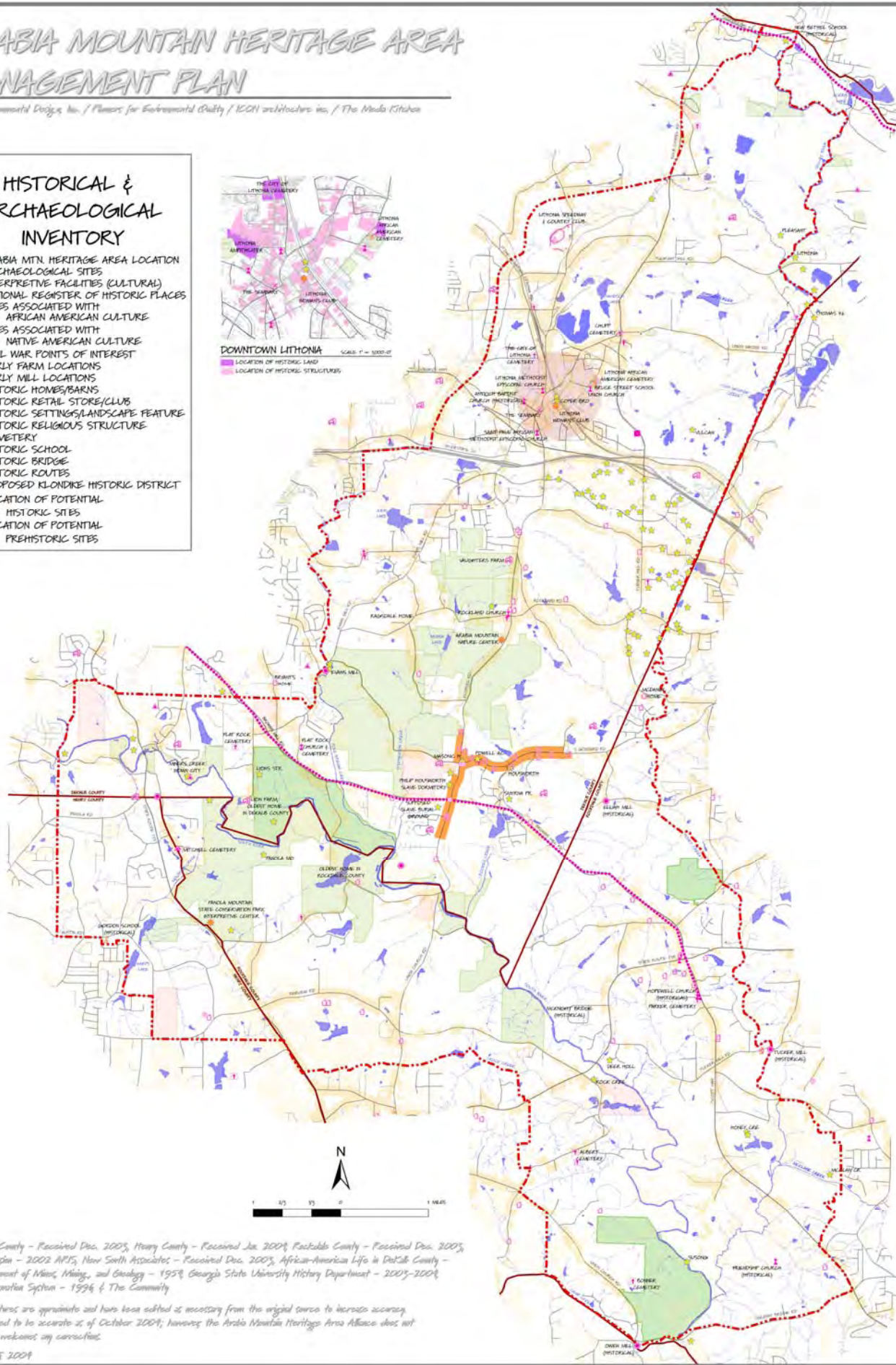
