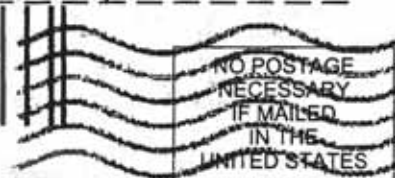

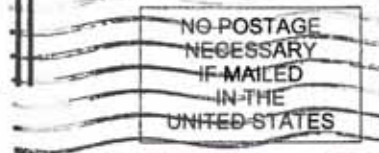

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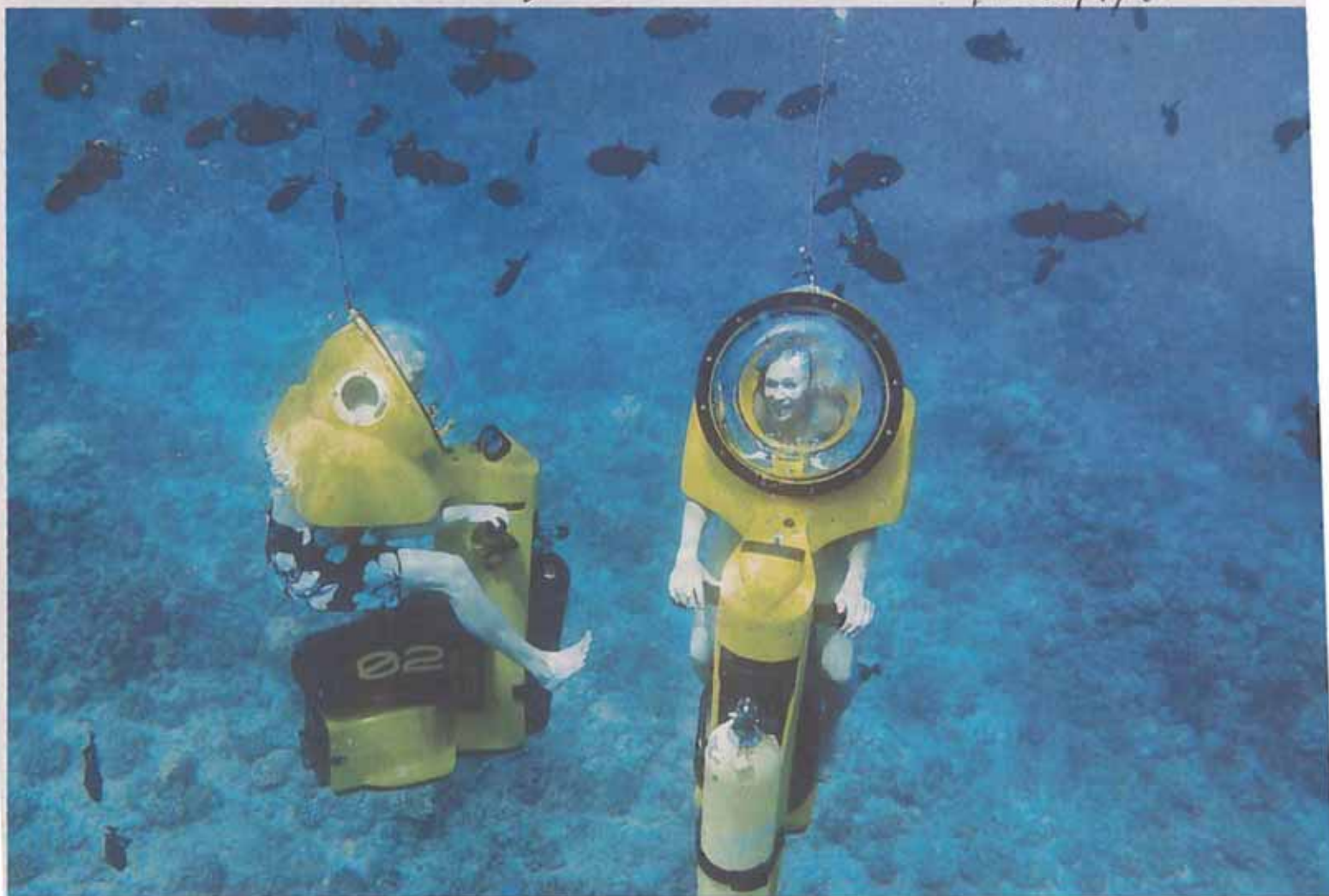

SUBJECT: Comments on General Management Plan, Draft 3

Thank you for the opportunity to submit comments on this draft of the General Management Plan. I appreciate the fact that the NPS has added this extra step to the usual process for soliciting public input.

I want to emphasize that my comments are my personal and individual comments, and are not necessarily the positions of the `Ohana or any other group with which I am associated.

That said, I want to endorse the recommendations of Ka `Ohana O Kalaupapa. The `Ohana's Position Paper of 2009 is a thoughtful and thorough document developed after decades (in some cases lifetimes) of experience with Kalaupapa and the patients, and coordination with other entities and individuals. It should be remembered that the majority of the members of the `Ohana are not "outsiders," but patients or family of patients, and individuals who have been deeply involved with the community for many years. I urge the NPS to go back and re-review the Position Paper as it prepares the next draft of the GMP.

Further, I endorse the recommendations of the `Ohana on this particular draft, as contained in the letter of our President, Boogie Kahilihiwa.

I am not endorsing any particular one of the four alternatives, but I do have some major and some minor recommendations or comments on this draft.

Preservation vs. access. Preservation and access are not mutually exclusive, as seems to be suggested in this draft. The concept of alternative B seems to be preservation: "focus on Kalaupapa's special or sacred places celebrated and made legendary by stories." (I would add "history"). And, "Maintaining Kalaupapa's spirit and character is the primary focus of this alternative." I support this.

However, the implementation of this concept seems extremely restrictive, e.g., no more than 100 visitors a day, nobody under the age of 16, much of the peninsula
