Waterfowl Sanctuary (Roaches Run) and a segment of the Mount Vernon Trail, all within George Washington Memorial Parkway.

There is a need to examine possible enhancements for optimal and sustainable resource use in the study area. This need is based on several cumulative factors, including:

 Limited access to Roaches Run, inefficient circulation through Gravelly Point, and deficiencies in facilities for visitor use

■ Safety concerns presented by heavy trail use and visitor use conflicts along the

Mount Vernon Trail at Gravelly Point

 Insufficient interpretation of natural and cultural resource features of Roaches Run and Gravelly Point
