PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD OPENS FOR PROPOSED REPAIRS TO LANDSLIDE AT WOOLUM ROAD

Superintendent Kevin G. Cheri announced today the National Park Service (NPS), in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration, is seeking public comment on the proposed repair of a landslide at Woolum Road, approximately 5 miles west of U.S. Highway 65, at the Buffalo National River. The proposed repairs would include stabilization of the failed slope and reconstruction of the rock wall that has collapsed as a result of frequent flooding. Proposed work may also include reconstruction or realignment of the road.

The public comment period will open on November 1, 2012 and close on November 30, 2012. During the 30-day public scoping period, all interested persons will be given the opportunity to review and provide comments on the proposed road repairs. Public scoping is part of the process to prepare an Environmental Assessment (EA) pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969.
