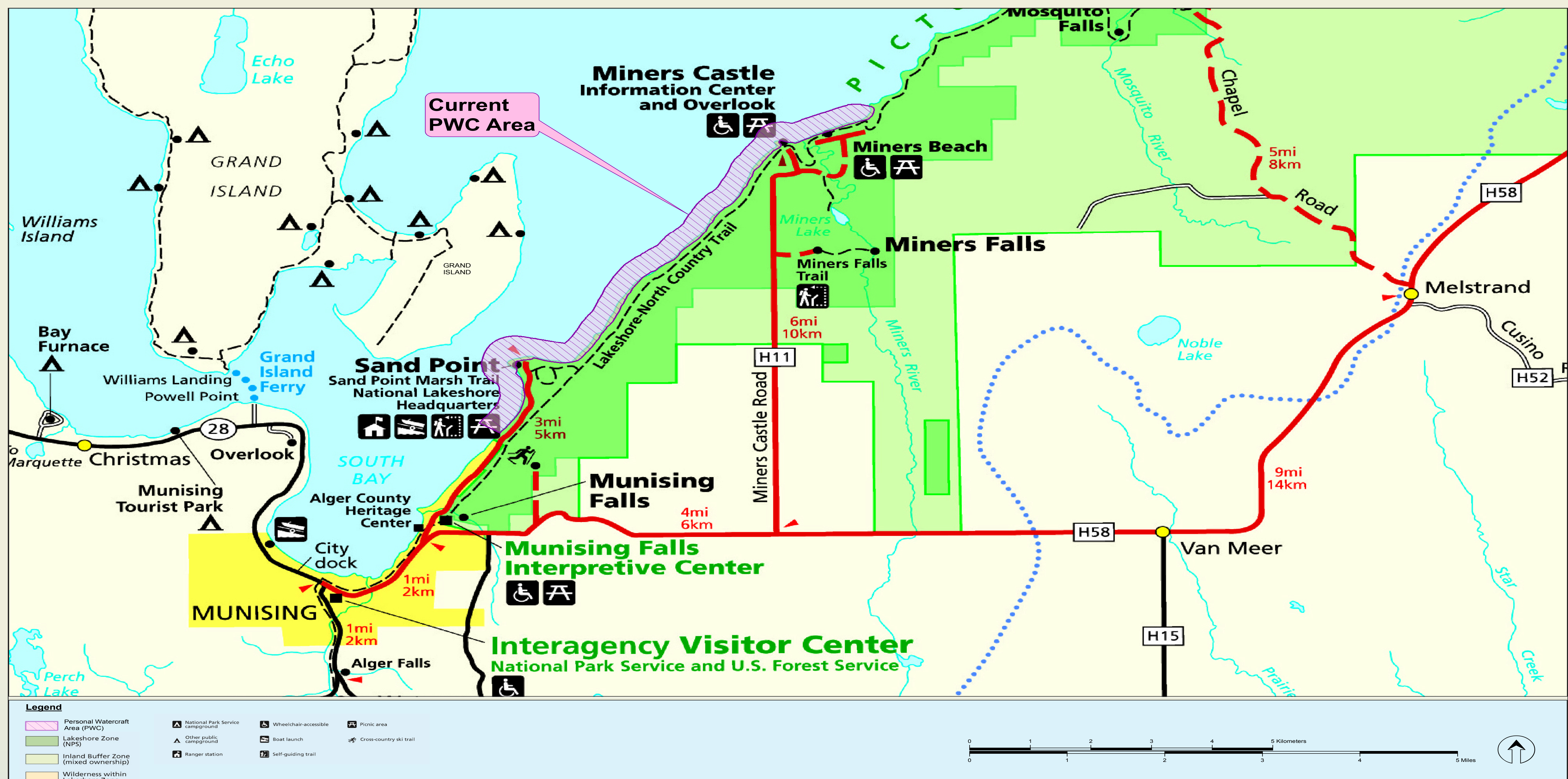




## Preliminary Alternatives



- Manage PWC use under the existing special regulation for the park (as shown above).
- Prohibit PWC use at Pictured Rocks.
- Allow PWC use on Lake Superior along the full length of the park (approximately 42 miles).

The following measures could be added to any action alternative allowing PWC use to better manage PWC use and better protect resources at the park:

- Restrict PWC use to only those with 4-stroke engines or best available technology.
- Implement a permit system for use of PWCs on Lake Superior within the park.
- Restrict PWC use adjacent to sensitive areas (Beaver Basin Wilderness, Grand Sable Dunes, and Chapel Beach).

### What is a PWC?

PWCs are defined as watercraft that are usually less than 16 feet in length, use an inboard internal combustion engine powering a water jet pump as its primary source of propulsion, and are intended to be operated by a person or persons sitting, standing or kneeling on the vessel.
