## **Categorical Exclusion Form**

Project: Sea Walk

**Project Description:** 

The project justification focuses on pedestrian traffic flow and visitor safety. By strategically widening the paved walkway, to between 6' and 8', into Sitka National Historical Park a Sea Walk trail will produce and enhance a memorable and safe experience for arriving Park visitors. The project will be coordinated with the City's Sea Walk, which was designed partially with FTA funding to be implemented as far as the Park boundary. Within the Park, the proposed Sea Walk continues the trail as it widens and narrows directly beside the coastline with one trail spur going to Merrill Rock, which is part of the cultural landscape. Brush thinning and trail in that area will increase visitor safety.

Some vegetation thinning along the Sea Walk is proposed to allow views and seating along the trail. Old Sitka Spruce and Alder where eagles perch will remain undisturbed while vegetation beneath their canopy will be thinned. Closer to the Visitor Center, some non-native rose bushes and a short fence will be removed and replaced with native plants. The new SITK Sea Walk will end at the Visitor Center entrance.
