Dear Friends:

Great Basin National Park has completed the *Fish Barrier (EA)*. This EA will be open to review for 30 days, from March 20 through April 20, 2013.

Great Basin National Park is proposing to construct a fish barrier on the lower portion of Snake Creek, near the park boundary. The proposed fish barrier is intended to prevent the upstream invasion of non-native fishes and aquatic invasive species into Snake Creek within the park, including portions occupied by a species of management concern, Bonneville cutthroat trout (*Onchorynchus clarki utah*, BCT). This action would help the park meet the Nevada Conservation Agreement and Conservation Strategy goals for BCT populations.

The EA, prepared in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), examines two alternatives: 1) Alternative A, the No Action Alternative, would not allow the Snake Creek Fish Barrier project to be undertaken and would continue the status quo of having an assumed fish barrier 9.0 km (5.6 mi) upstream from the park boundary; and 2) Alternative B, the Proposed Action, which would allow for the construction of a fish barrier on Snake Creek near the park boundary.
