Dear Friend of the Park:

The National Park Service has prepared an environmental assessment on a proposal to restore habitat for anadromous salmonids, including threatened coho salmon and steelhead trout, in Strawberry Creek in Redwood National Park near Orick in northwestern Humboldt County.

We propose to restore about 1600 linear feet of stream channel on park lands in partnership with others engaged in similar restoration activities on Strawberry Creek downstream of the park, including private land and County-owned property. Proposed restoration activities in the park include removing invasive plants and excavating a new free-flowing channel, installing structures in the new channel to control streambed elevation and provide fish habitat features, reestablishing a riparian canopy along the new channel, replacing an undersized culvert, and removing sediment sources on adjacent hillslopes. About three acres of park land would be affected by restoration actions.

The environmental assessment is available for review at local libraries and park offices.
