What is Proposed?

The National Park Service is proposing an increase to several fees at Glen Canyon National Recreation Area.


Entrance fees provide the visitor with access to the basic park amenities, such as Visitor Centers, restrooms, picnic areas, interpretive programs and the like.


- Interagency Access and Military Passes remain available at no charge.
- Persons under 16 years of age are not charged an entrance fee.
- There is no proposed increase for Interagency Senior (\$10 /life) and Annual Pass (\$80 / year) prices or commercial tour fees at this time.

Enhanced amenity fees allow visitors to utilize campgrounds, boat launch ramps and other amenities that are not needed by all visitors.


- Interagency Senior and Access pass holders would continue to receive a 50% discount on camping and boat use fees. (This only applies to National Park Service Campgrounds. Concession-operated campgrounds do not honor the 50% discount)
- Boat Use Fees: All motorized vessels would be charged a full fee and discounts for additional motorized water craft on one trailer would be eliminated.

If approved, the fee increases would be phased in over the next three years beginning in May of 2015.
