



How Would Additional Fees be Used in the Future?

Throughout the National Park Service fee revenue may be used for projects that benefit park visitors by improving visitor facilities, programs, or services; which must meet at least one of the following expenditure categories:



Repair, maintain, and enhance facilities for visitor use



Interpretation, visitor information, and signs



Habitat restoration related to recreation, such as hunting, fishing, wildlife observation, or photography



Direct costs associated with the recreation fee program

At Glen Canyon National Recreation Area additional fee revenue may be used to support a wide range of projects. This may include, but is not limited to:



Chasing the water

- Fluctuating lake levels require extensive efforts to extend launch ramps, move docks, aids to navigation, and lake access facilities.



Improved Visitor Access & Experience

- Trail development and enhancement projects may be funded to provide greater opportunities for visitors to enjoy Glen Canyon National Recreation Area.
- Improvements to campgrounds, picnic areas, and other facilities may also be supported.
- Rehabilitation and Enhancement of cultural resource sites, water resources, and other park resources that contribute to visitor experience are also proposed.
