



How Have Fees Been Used in the Past?

Many projects in Glen Canyon National Recreation Area to improve visitor experience have been completed with fee revenues or are currently in process. Here are just a few of them:



Improve Lake Access and Usage – the Antelope Point launch ramp was extended to improve visitor access during low water conditions. Repairs were made to the Dangling Rope boat dock. Floating restrooms were installed. Roads and parking areas that provide access to the lake have been maintained or improved.



Interpretive Visitor Services Improvements – The exhibits at the Carl Hayden Visitor Center are being redesigned and replaced in partnership with the Bureau of Reclamation. Past projects have included installing new audio-visual equipment, the new touch screen electronic information kiosk, the development of park brochures and improvements to the park website.



Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention and Management – Lake Powell was predicted to be the first large water body in the west to be infested with zebra mussels. Through an extensive prevention and monitoring program the NPS was able to delay the arrival of quagga mussels for years, and was able to detect the population at a very early stage that will help prevent the spread to other waters in the future.
