  - 2016-2017 you will have a chance to provide input on alternatives for Visitor Use Management














## FUNDAMENTAL RESOURCES AND VALUES

- Water quality and flood protection








# Sustainable Access to High-quality Recreation Opportunities


The river and surrounding landscapes provide a wide variety of opportunities including:


- Variety of river and landscape options


## Stunning Scenic Resources and Distinct Aesthetic Values

The river, ridges, cliffs and valleys provide a striking backdrop for visitor enjoyment:

- Middle Delaware River framed by Kittatinny Ridge and Pocono Plateau
- Islands, forests, streams, fields, ravines, waterfalls
- Dark skies
- Changing seasons








## **Changing Land Use**
