

CONSULTATION AND COORDINATION

1

2 As required by 36 CFR 800.8 (2)(c), the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation
3 (ACHP) was notified that the National Park Service plans to use the environmental
4 assessment process to accomplish compliance for both Section 106, in accordance
5 with the National Historic Preservation Act as amended, and the National
6 Environmental Policy Act (NEPA, as described in 36 Code of Federal Regulations
7 800.8(a-c)) to analyze potential project effects. The consultation and coordination
8 efforts required by Section 106 will be accomplished as part of the NEPA process.
9 The National Park Service plans to use this environmental assessment process and
10 documentation to comply with Section 106 requirements. A Section 106 consultation
11 letter describing the project and inviting continuing agency participation also was
12 sent to the State Historic Preservation Officer (see Appendix A for copies of letters).

13 The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service was contacted regarding endangered and
14 threatened species compliance for this project via a stakeholders meeting conducted
15 on March 3, 2003.

16 During scoping for this project, representatives of the Caddo Nation of Oklahoma
17 including tribal Chair Larue Parker, Tribal NAGPRA representative Bobby Gonzalez
18 and Tribal Historic Preservation Officer Robert Cast visited Cane River Creole
19 National Historical Park to informally discuss the development of the potential
20 shared visitor center. They had no comments at that time. Copies of this
21 environmental assessment will be sent to tribes who have expressed an interest in the
22 project (see "List of Recipients").

23 A four-page scoping brochure/newsletter was distributed to individuals,
24 organizations, agencies, and Indian tribes and was posted on the park's website.
25 Letters were sent to local and county leaders. The park also held public scoping
26 workshops in Natchitoches on January 21, 2004, April 20, 2004, and June 21, 2004.
