INTENT TO RELY ON NEPA DOCUMENT

Project Title: Yosemite Village Day-Use Parking Area Project

Project Location: Yosemite Valley, Yosemite National Park, Mariposa County, CA 95389

<u>Project Description:</u> The National Park Service (NPS) is proposing to complete the Yosemite Village Day-Use Parking Area Project in Yosemite National Park. The Project will improve roadways and construct a new 350-vehicle day-use parking area with gravel parking spaces, paved drive aisles, and landscaped islands. A segment of Northside Drive will be relocated, and new pedestrian pathways, shuttle bus stop, and comfort station will be constructed. The Project includes restoration and enhancement of wetland habitat.

In connection with this project, NPS has applied for Clean Water Act section 404 permit coverage under Army Corps of Engineers Nationwide Permit 39. Section 401 of the Clean Water Act requires a section 404 permit applicant to obtain a state certification that the resulting discharge will comply with water quality standards (Water Quality Certification). NPS applied to the California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (Central Valley Water Board) for such a Water Quality Certification, the issuance of which is subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

NPS, as Lead Agency under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), prepared an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Merced Wild and Scenic River Comprehensive Management Plan and circulated it for public comment. Based on the EIS and the comments received, Christine S. Lehnertz, Regional Director, Pacific West Region of the National Park Service, approved a Record of Decision (ROD) for the proposed project on 4 September 2014.

Pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15220 and following, the Central Valley Water Board, as Lead Agency under CEQA, has determined that the EIS prepared by NPS meets the requirements of CEQA. Accordingly, the Central Valley Water Board proposes to use the EIS instead of preparing a separate CEQA document. This public notice is being circulated pursuant to section 15225 of the CEQA Guidelines.
