Negotiated Rulemaking Committee Established and Concurrent EIS
for Dog Management Initiated



Three notices relating to Dog Management at Golden Gate National Recreation Area have been published in the Federal Register:

- February 17, 2006
 The Notice of Establishment and Notice of Meeting of the Negotiated Rulemaking Advisory Committee for Dog Management at Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA), a committee to potentially develop a special regulation for dog management at GGNRA. - February 22, 2006
 The Notice of Intent to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to examine the beneficial and adverse impacts of a full range of options for a Dog Management Plan for GGNRA. The Negotiated Rulemaking Committee, representing the diverse interests likely to be affected by a dog management plan, has been appointed by the Secretary of the Interior to develop consensus recommendations to the park about where it may be appropriate to allow dogwalking in GGNRA-managed lands. The negotiated rulemaking (reg-neg) process will run concurrently with the EIS process to allow information sharing. The park intends to integrate the recommendations of the committee's efforts into one or more alternatives for analysis in the EIS. The final plan/EIS will become the basis of a formal "rulemaking" process that will establish regulations for dogwalking in GGNRA.

Upcoming Public Meetings

Negotiated Rulemaking Committee: the first meeting will be held on March 6, 2006, in Building A, Lower Fort Mason from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. The public may attend this working committee meeting and comment on agenda items under rules to be established by the committee.

Public Scoping Workshops for the EIS: Two public workshops will be held in April 2006 to present the scope of the Dog Management Plan/EIS. A brochure describing the scope and giving meeting dates and locations will be sent to the park mailing list in March and made available on the NPS planning website (<http://parkplanning.nps.gov/goga>). Select Golden Gate National Recreation Area, then click on "EIS/Dog Management Plan for GGNRA". The public will be invited to submit ideas on the scope of the EIS either at the public workshops in April, in writing, or online.
