The Executive Leadership Team has reviewed the proposed project/action and completed its environmental assessment documentation, and we have determined the following:

- There will not be any effect on threatened, endangered, or rare species and/or their critical habitat.
- There will be no adverse effect on historical, cultural, or archeological resources.
- There will not be serious or long-term undesirable environmental or visual effects.

The subject proposed project, therefore, is now cleared for all NEPA and NHPA compliance requirements as presented above. Project plans and specifications are approved and construction and/or project implementation can commence.

For the proposed project actions to be within compliance requirements during construction and/or project implementation, the following mitigations must be adhered to:

- Archeological monitoring is required during tree felling
- Install gravel at the entrance if necessary, but no gravel is to be used in the rest of the lot
- No grading Do not disturb piles of soil from the Emergency Services Complex project
- Avoid parking under the dripline of California black oak trees
- Contact USADig
- Restore the area to natural conditions after November 18, 2016. Lot to be closed at this time.

# Categorical Exclusion Form

**Project:** 2016-031 Upper River Temporary Parking

PEPC Project Number: 67080

**Description of Action (Project Description):** 

Additional parking is required in Yosemite Valley for day-use visitors while the park completes parking and road improvements in 2016. Yosemite will open a portion of the Upper River area for parking between mid-September and November 18, 2016. Upper River was once the site of a campground, which the park removed after repeated flood damage. The site was also used as an informal staging area.

The park will allow parking only in areas of dried herbaceous vegetation, outside the drip-line of California black oak trees and away from young and mature conifers. Park crews will mark parking boundaries with construction fencing. About 15 dead hazard trees and one live conifer (<24" dbh) require removal. There will be no grading and the park will restore the site to natural conditions after November 18, 2016.

## **Mitigation(s):**

- Archeological monitoring is required during tree felling
- Install gravel at the entrance if necessary, but no gravel is to be used in the rest of the lot

- Restore the area to natural conditions after November 18, 2016. Lot to be closed at this time.
