We have reviewed the materials submitted on the NPS, 55038, 2017 Invasive Management Plan for Crater Lake National Park referenced above and we concur that there are currently nearly fifty contributing resources and three historic districts within the boundaries of Crater Lake National Park that are eligible for and/or listed in the National Register of Historic Places. Concerning above-ground historic properties, we concur with the finding of no adverse effect for the proposed vegetation management plan. Again, this letter refers to above-ground historic resources only and comments pursuant to a review for archaeological resources will be sent separately.

Unless there are changes to the project, this concludes the requirement for consultation with our office under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (per 36 CFR Part 800) for above-ground historic resources.
