Describe project:

Upon inspection during the course of the 3R work these parking lots were determined to be in far worse shape than originally thought. Doing the work on these parking lots now will provide significant cost savings to the Park due to the Contractor already being on site and not having to mobilize in and out for this work. Also there will be significant savings to the park based on economy of scale associated with this project. If this project is not completed now, it is not certain when the funds, and contracting would be able to complete. These parking lots will be pulverized and then the material will be compacted to provide a structural base and then 3" of new asphalt will be laid. There will be significant impact to Park visitors while these parking areas are closed. There will be no new ground disturbance since all work is on the existing parking areas of asphalt and concrete. The areas of the existing parking lots is Courthouse Towers (15,000 sf), Park Avenue (24,191 sf), and Balance Rock 27,000 sf). There will be some widening of the entrance and exit travel lanes in the Balanced Rock parking lot, which will involve removing and replacing some curbing along the traffic island between the road and parking lot.
