The battlefield will be closed Tuesday, February 13th due to expected inclement weather.

Chronic Wasting Disease Public Meeting Rescheduled

Due to expected inclement weather, the National Park Service public meeting at Monocacy National Battlefield for the development of a Chronic Wasting Disease plan has been rescheduled. There will be a meeting tonight in the Visitor Center at Antietam National Battlefield, Sharpsburg, Maryland, off MD 65, 10 miles south of I-70 (exit 29) and 1 mile north of Sharpsburg. The re-scheduled meeting at Monocacy National Battlefield will take place on Tuesday, February 20, 2007 in the Gambrill House off MD 355 three miles south of the City of Frederick. The Gambrill House is located near the Monocacy National Battlefield Visitor Center at 4801 Urbana Pike. Both meetings will begin at 6:30 p.m. and end at 9:00 p. m. The format will include an initial sign-in and open house, followed by a welcome and presentations, and conclude with an additional open house format.
