## SCENIC EASEMENT

WHEREAS, Section 149(a) (14) of Title I of the Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistant Act of 1987 (Pub. L. 100-17; 101 Stat. 132, 183; April 2, 1987), as amended by Section 338 of the Department of Transportation and Related Agencies Appropriation Act of 1990 (Pub. L. 101-164; 103 Stat. 1069, 1099; November 21, 1989) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), calls for "a demonstration project in the vicinity of the C&O Canal in the District of Columbia for the purpose of substantially improving motor vehicle access at a major traffic generator without decreasing the efficiency of a Federal-aid primary highway" (hereinafter referred to as the "Demonstration Project.")

WHEREAS, the Act provides that "[n]o Federal assistance shall be provided to carry out the [Demonstration Project] until private sources dedicate 2.5 acres of land as a scenic easement for project purposes."

WHEREAS, the Demonstration Project will be of significant benefit to the Grantor; and

WHEREAS, a determination has been made by the Federal Highway Administration that the dedication of 2.5 acres to the Grantee by the Grantor for use as a permanent scenic easement for the Demonstration Project will, pursuant to the Act, satisfy the 20 percent state or local matching of Federal funds as required by Title 23, United States Code; and

WHEREAS, the Grantor is the owner in fee simple of the real property hereinafter described, which it desires to preserve as open-space land.

NOW, THEREFORE, in recognition of the foregoing, and in consideration of the mutual covenants herein and the acceptance hereof by the Grantee, the Grantor in accordance with the provisions below, does hereby grant and convey to the Grantee and its assigns at no cost, an exclusive and perpetual open-space, scenic easement over, and the right in perpetuity to restrict the use of, the real estate consisting of 2.5 acres, located in Washington, D.C., and more particularly described on <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> attached hereto, hereinafter referred to as the "Property."

The acquiring Federal agency is the Department of the Interior, National Park Service.

The scope of the foregoing easement, the acts which the Grantor covenants to do and not to do upon the Property, and the restrictions which the Grantee is hereby entitled to enforce, are and shall be, in their entirety, as follows:

No permanent building shall be built or maintained on the Property.

- No trees shall be cut down on the Property which are greater than 6 inches in diameter at breast height (dbh) measured at 4' 6" above grade without the written consent of Grantee, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Grantee shall not withhold consent for the cutting down of a tree or trees greater than 6 inches dbh if necessary for the building of a private road as described in Section 3 below.
- Private roads and utilities may be constructed on the Property; however no road shall be constructed which would connect the north and south parts of the Georgetown University campus other than a gated road for service vehicles.
- Representatives of the Grantee may enter the Property from time to time for purposes of inspection and enforcement of the terms of this scenic easement after permission from or reasonable prior notice to Grantor or Grantor's representative.

Nothing herein shall be construed to convey to the public any right or benefit, including without limitation any right of access to or use with respect to the Property. The Grantors, their heirs, successors, personal representatives and assigns, hereby retain all rights not expressly conveyed herein, including without limitation the exclusive right to such access and use, subject to the terms hereof.
