#### A. PROJECT INFORMATION

#### B. PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND

The purpose of this project is to provide new bear-proof food lockers for Curry Village tent cabin guests. Currently guests staying in the Curry Village tent cabins cannot have food or other bear attractants in their tents. Bear-proof food lockers have been installed in the Curry Village parking lot to allow visitors and Curry Village Tent Cabin guests to remove food from their cars and store it safely away from bears. As a result, bear damage to vehicles at Curry Village has declined greatly, and fewer bears are being exposed to human food. The food storage lockers are now falling apart, undermining this service to visitors and tent cabin guests, and compromising the safety to both visitors and bears. This project addresses both health and life-safety concerns by providing a safe place for guests to store their food from bears and other wildlife while staying in Curry Village.

Each of the 429 tent cabins in Curry Village will have its own locker. Lockers will be placed in the front or on the side of each tent cabin. Lockers will be either bolted to the tent frame or anchored to the ground with a metal post, placed 20 inches beneath the ground. The post is approximately 3.5 inches in diameter and will aid in leveling the lockers in situations that will not allow the locker to be bolted to the tent frame. There are 170 tent cabins within the Merced Wild and Scenic River corridor. The lockers at these cabins will be installed by bolting them to the tent cabin frame to avoid any type of ground disturbance. To minimize the visual impact of the lockers on the cultural landscape and be compatible with the historic district, the lockers will be painted green with a non-glossy finish to prevent glare and match the existing tent platforms. Each locker will be custom sized to be compatible with the two existing tent sizes. The final placement of lockers will be done in consultation with the Historic Architecture and Landscape staff. Photo documentation in accordance with Stipulation VIII A (b) of the 1999 PA will be conducted prior to any project implementation activities by in-house HAL staff.





# **Curry Village Food Locker Project**





Currently guests staying in the Curry Village tent cabins cannot have food or other bear attractants in their tents. Bear-proof food lockers have been installed in the Curry Village parking lot to allow visitors and Curry Village Tent Cabin guests to remove food from their cars and store it safely away from bears. As a result, bear damage to vehicles at Curry Village has declined greatly, and fewer bears are being exposed to human food. The food storage lockers are now falling apart, undermining this service to visitors and tent cabin guests, and compromising the safety to both visitors and bears. This project addresses both health and life-safety concerns by providing a safe place for guests to store their food from bears and other wildlife while staying in Curry Village. Each of the 429 tent cabins in Curry Village will have its own locker. Lockers will be placed in the front or on the side of each tent cabin. Lockers will be either bolted to the tent frame or anchored to the ground with a metal post, placed 20 inches beneath the ground. The post is approximately 3.5 inches in diameter and will aid in leveling the lockers in situations that will not allow the locker to be bolted to the tent frame. There are 170 tent cabins within the Merced Wild and Scenic River corridor. The lockers at these cabins will be installed by bolting them to the tent cabin frame to avoid any type of ground disturbance. To minimize the visual impact of the lockers on the cultural landscape and be compatible with the historic district, the lockers will be painted green with a non-glossy finish to prevent glare and match the existing tent platforms. Each locker will be custom sized to be compatible with the two existing tent sizes. The final placement of lockers will be done in consultation with the Historic Architecture and Landscape staff. Photo documentation in accordance with Stipulation VIII A (b) of the 1999 PA will be conducted prior to any project implementation activities by in-house HAL staff.
