## Purpose and Need 😕



#### Purpose –

 Identify a suite of strategies and actions to manage transportation, visitation and visitor use, trail use and access throughout the corridor.

#### Need -

- The plan is needed to address a range of changing conditions and challenges with the GTSR corridor associated with unprecedented visitation levels and dynamic use patterns.
- These include: roadway gridlock and parking lot congestion; visitor safety issues; natural and cultural resource impacts and heavy stress on park facilities, services and operations.

#### A- No Action

**B** –Adaptive Management Approach to Address Visitation Levels (Preferred **Alternative**)

Possible Actions within the GTSR corridor and during peak season subject to funding and triggers:

- Expand shuttle system with additional buses, extended hours and six new stops.
- Extend Visitor Center hours.
- Construct new 100 car parking lot on the west side and increase parking at St. Mary VC and 1913 Ranger Station.
- Manage trail use levels during peak season to provide a range of visitor experiences and for visitor safety. (Ex. Highline, Siyeh and Gunsight).













## Preferred Alternative Continued

- Add five miles of hiking trails, 1.5 miles of bike trails, and pit toilets on popular trails.
- Require parking permits for a portion of parking lots at Logan Pass, and St. Mary Virginia Falls.
- Prohibit overnight parking.
- Convert portion of Avalanche Campground to day use parking.
- Enhance bicycle opportunities.



Note: Data reflects postings on Glacier's Twitter of parking lot or road closures or other restrictions due to crowding. Data from July 1 through August 18 for each year.














## Sweet Spot: Demand for Outdoor Recreation


















#### Logan Pass Filled by 9:30am, Peak Congestion at 1p
