Although none of the “known” species currently inhabit the park, the bald eagle and the least tern have been known to frequent the park on numerous occasions. A bald eagle nest was observed in the park in 2003 and 2004 until it was destroyed by a wind event in the spring of 2004. No tern or eagle nests are currently known to be located in the park.

Observations taken in the park indicate that there are no plant species found from the state or federal endangered or threatened species list (Clambey 1985 and Lenz 1993).
