# Shaping the Future of the Signal Hill and Field Hospital at the Wallis Farm

Dear Friends,

Thank you for taking the time to join us in this planning process. Your interest and vested time will help guide the future of the Kennesaw Mountain Battlefield Signal Hill and Field Hospital at the Wallis Farm.

Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park (the park) preserves and interprets the sites of the US Civil War Battles of Kolb Farm and Kennesaw Mountain, which occurred between June 18 and July 2, 1864, as a part of General William T. Sherman's Atlanta Campaign.

The National Park Service (NPS) is preparing a Cultural Landscape Report (CLR) for two parcels the NPS is in the process of acquiring. The cultural landscape includes the Josiah S. Wallis House, which served as the temporary headquarters of Union Major-General Oliver Otis Howard and a field hospital for both Federal and Confederate soldiers, as well as a hill that provided key terrain for Confederate earthworks and a Civil War signal station. The CLR will provide strategies for preservation, wayfinding, interpretation, circulation, facilities, and landscape management.

#### PURPOSE OF THE PROJECT

The purpose of this Cultural Landscape Report (CLR) is to investigate, document, evaluate, and provide treatment guidance for the physical landscape associated with the Signal Hill and Field Hospital at the Wallis Farm (study area).

#### **KEY ISSUES**

As a new addition to the park, the study area will require wayfinding, interpretive messaging, trails, and visitor facilities. In addition, the plan will identify strategies to address the following key issues:

- Significant views between the Signal Hill and Big and Little Kennesaw Mountains and Wallis house and Burnt Hickory Road are obscured.
- Historic buildings and structures including the Wallis House, Original Well, and Confederate earthworks require stabilization.
- The existing parking lot at the base of the Signal Hill is not currently a fee area.
- Erosion occurs on steep slopes throughout the study area.
- Wayfinding is needed between the new parcels and the contiguous battlefield park property.

#### What is a Cultural Landscape Report?



A Cultural Landscape Report (CLR) is the primary report that documents the history, significance, and treatment of a cultural landscape. A CLR evaluates the history and integrity of the landscape including any changes to its geographical context, features, materials, and use.



#### **DRAFT STRATEGIES**

We want to hear from you! Please share your thoughts about our draft strategies to address the issues and let us know if there are other actions that we should consider. Draft strategies include:

- Add signage along Burnt Hickory Road and the existing parking area with clear fee and wayfinding information.
- Add an interpretive trail from the existing parking area to the top of Signal Hill.
- Stabilize the Confederate earthworks, Farm Lane, and trees that likely date to the battles.
- Preserve the Wallis House and Original Well, and conduct a Historic Structures Report to determine long-term treatment.
- Selectively thin vegetation so that visitors can understand the view between Signal Hill and Kennesaw Mountain /Pigeon Hill.
- Install waysides interpreting the Wallis House, Signal Hill, and battlefield protection efforts.
- Establish a barrier free sidewalk connection between the existing parking area and the Wallis House parcel.
- At the Wallis House parcel, remove buildings and structures, ornamental vegetation, undergrowth, and other features added after the battles to clarify understanding of the cultural landscape. Establish rough lawn around the house.
- Add snake rail fences in historic locations to reinforce historic character.
- Add seating opportunities throughout the site.
- Consider adding a comfort station and outdoor gathering space at the Wallis House parcel.
- Consider relocating the historical marker to improve visibility and visitor safety.
