

**PROPOSED CHANGES
SUPERINTENDENT'S COMPENDIUM
2022
GLACIER BAY NATIONAL PARK AND PRESERVE**

The Superintendent is seeking public comment on the proposed changes to the Superintendent's Compendium. The proposed compendium is a written compilation of designations, closures, permit requirements and other restrictions adopted under the Superintendent's discretionary authority.

After review and consideration of the need for annual updates, the following changes regarding public use are proposed.

36 CFR 13.45(c) Property

The NPS proposes to change the language and timelines surrounding the identified parking areas as follows:

- **Parking**
 - Public Use Dock Parking Lot: Leaving vehicles, trailers, or other property unattended overnight in the parking lot is prohibited.
 - Long Term Parking: Leaving vehicles, trailers, or other property unattended longer than 14 days in the parking lot adjacent to the park fuel dock, the maintenance facility lot, the Bartlett River Trailhead lot, or in the lot near the NPS housing area is prohibited.
 - Except as provided otherwise above, vehicles, trailers, or other property must be removed for at least 24 hours between parking limit periods.

Reason for this proposed change: This change would clarify the names of identified parking areas and ensure equal parking opportunity among users during peak visitation times.

36 CFR 13.1120 Bartlett Cove Developed Area closures and restrictions

The NPS proposes to limit the use of firewood provided in the Bartlett Cove campground as follows:

Removing firewood provided in the Bartlett Cove campground woodshed for use outside of the campground is prohibited.

Reason for this proposed change: This ensures that the firewood provided in the campground is used as intended.

36 CFR 13.1122(c) Bartlett Cove Public Use Dock

The NPS proposes to change the language addressing leaving of personal property unattended on (or attached to) the dock as follows:

Leaving a kayak unattended on the floats or pier without prior permission from the Superintendent is prohibited.

Reason for this proposed change: This change would clarify that kayaks are not permitted to be left unattended on the public use dock.

36 CFR 13.1184 –Other restrictions on vessels

The NPS proposes to remove regulations surrounding a designated portion of the Bartlett Cove Public Use Dock. The language proposed to be removed:

September 16 – October 1

- One hundred feet of the NW section of the outer dock face will be reserved for tour vessels or the immediate transfer of passengers and supplies. See attached Compendium Maps.

Reason for this proposed change: The need to identify a limited use of this space on the dock has not been demonstrated to be necessary.
