Notice of Realty Action – Proposed Revision of Park Boundary, City of Rocks National Reserve

Pursuant to the authority found in the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1967, 78 Stat. 897, as amended, 54 United States Code (U.S.C.) Section 100506(c), notice is hereby given that the National Park Service (NPS) intends to revise the boundary of City of Rocks National Reserve (Reserve) in Cassia County, Idaho, to include the following additional property:

Real property totaling 105.08 acres (100 acres of ownership and 5.08 acres of access easements) within a portion of Cassia County Real Property Tax Numbers RP15S24E190000 and RP15S24E1800600 as depicted on the map titled, “City of Rocks National Reserve, Proposed Acquisition Tracts 101-13, 101-14, and 101-15,” prepared by the NPS.

This map is available on the NPS’s Planning, Environment and Public Comment (PEPC) site at https://parkplanning.nps.gov/CIRO_Expansion. You may also request a copy of the map by emailing pwr_realty_officer@nps.gov or CIRO_Superintendent@nps.gov.

The proposed expansion area is adjacent to the northeastern portion of the Reserve. The proposed revision will allow the NPS to acquire the land necessary to provide public access to Graham Creek Canyon and increased recreational opportunities in the area.
