Project Description: The National Park Service is proposing to construct a new maintenance facility at the King Salmon administrative site. The structure would be located within the existing equipment storage yard. The approximate size of the proposed building is 4,500 square feet. The structure will be a prefab metal building, set on a concrete perimeter footing with reinforced concrete slab. The building will be divided into a carpentry shop, plumbing/electrical shop, vehicle/boat repair bays, welding area, storage, and locker room. It will include dust collection. Site work includes providing connections to the nearby borough sewer main, the NPS domestic water system, and Naknek Electrical Association power. National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) compliance has been previously completed for the proposed project. This compliance is documented within the 1983 King Salmon Headquarters Development Concept Plan (DCP) and the 1994 King Salmon Administrative Site Employee Housing and Maintenance Facilities Construction Environmental Assessment (EA) and Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) statement.
