Mr. DeAngelis, thank you for reaching out to the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. Because the Department is involved in numerous facets there is no clear cut universal answer. I can let you know that from the RCRA-C program that Missouri doesn't have any State specific regulations regarding firing ranges. We mirror the federal regulations quite closely. The EPA has determined that firing a bullet is not an act of disposal however, once you start digging up soil and generating wastes RCRA-C would be applicable to all those streams. It is difficult to give specifics without knowing what exactly where these ranges are and what the plans are for them. If you can supply more detail I can try to give more specific information.

Our CERCLA group is aware of this inquiry and should be responding with their requirements. I have forwarded it on to the Water Protection Program since watershed in the ONSR needs to be evaluated as well.
