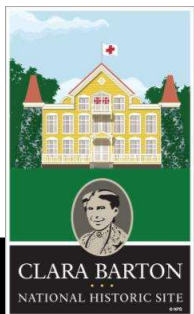
Participant Involvement

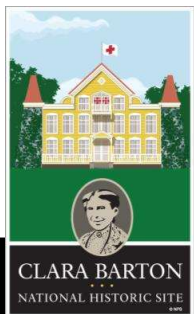
Updates Since Last Consulting Parties Meeting
