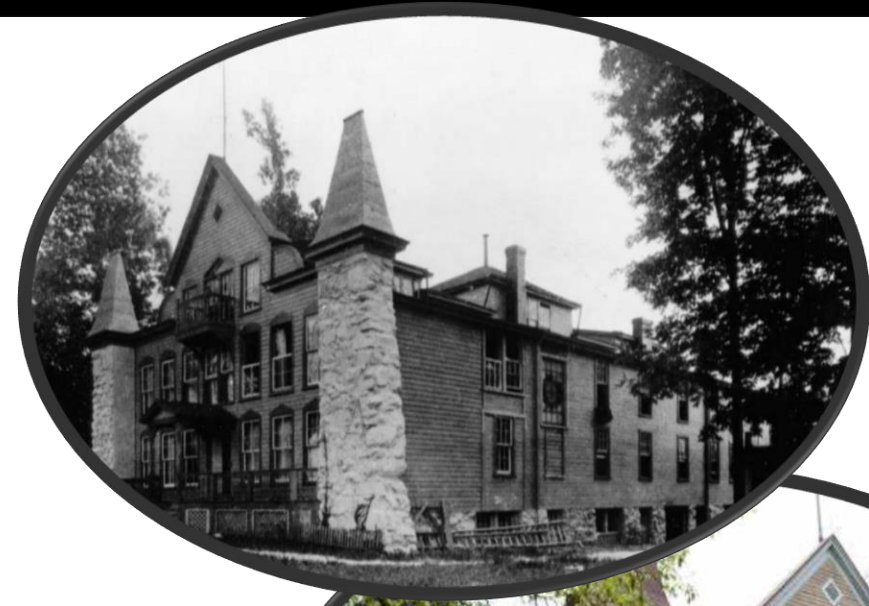

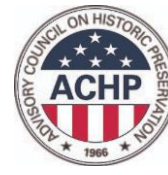

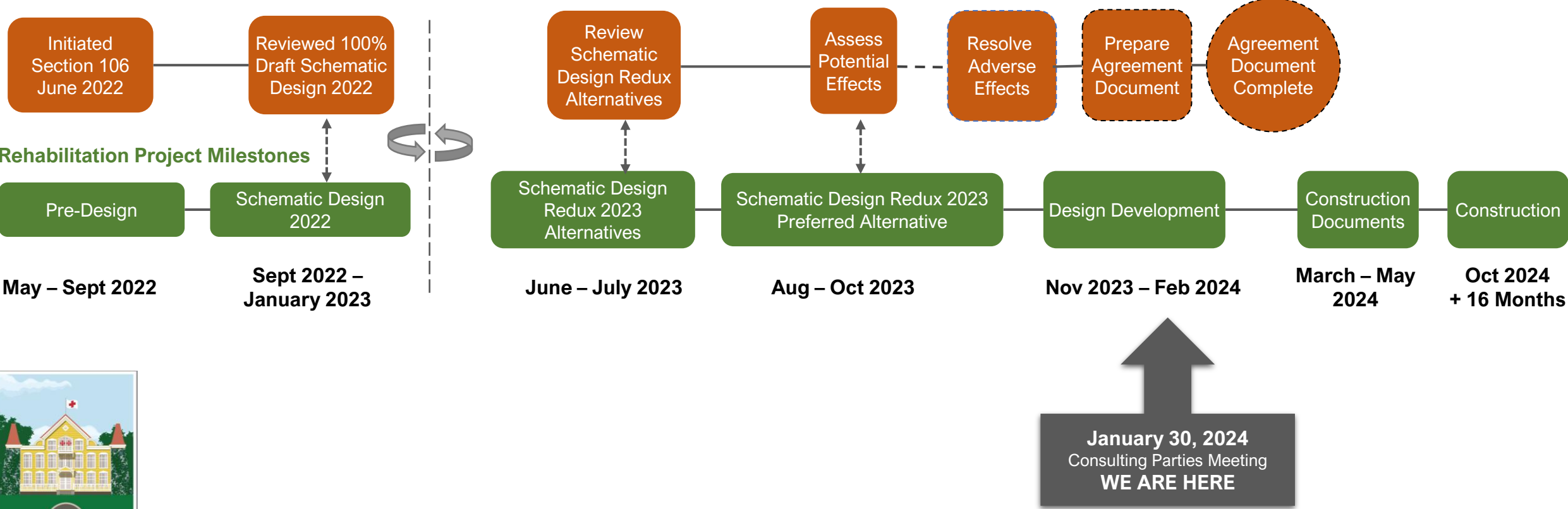
Mills and Schnoering Architects Schematic Design Alternatives

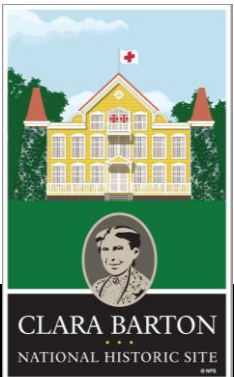
