# Rancho Corral De Tierra – Community Engagement Summary

February 2022 - October 2023

# **Project Background**

Rancho Corral de Tierra (Rancho) is one of the largest undeveloped pieces of public land on the San Mateo peninsula and was once planned for residential and highway development. The Peninsula Open Space Trust (POST) gathered the support of private donors and grants to purchase the site to protect Rancho's awe-inspiring views, vital watersheds, public trails, and diverse wildlife. In 2011, federal legislation passed to add this parcel to the Golden Gate National Recreation Area (GGNRA). With community input, the park developed broad management goals for the park's 2014 General Management Plan (GMP). As the newest addition to the Golden Gate National Recreation Area in San Mateo County, the project site requires a Comprehensive Site Management Plan (Site Plan) to steward this park and provide management goals for the future. The Site Plan will be consistent with the GMP and provide additional details needed to define future investment and management needed to carry out park and community objectives.

Rancho includes a 16-mile network of trails, four equestrian facilities, four watersheds, 10 miles of creeks, and unique coastal habitat home to several threatened and endangered species. National Park Service (NPS) staff have spent the past few years collecting data, establishing baseline conditions, evaluating and maintaining trails, addressing incompatible uses, and observing visitor use patterns.

Surrounding community members and existing/adjacent park users are vital stakeholders in the successful planning for restoration, trails, recreation, and long-term stewardship. Thanks to the Priority Conservation Area (PCA) grant funds from the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy (Parks Conservancy) has the opportunity to build authentic engagement within the community and connect with new audiences to develop a shared vision for the site. One of the key goals throughout the Community Brainstorm and Ideas Share Back phase is to think of ways to increase equitable access, make programs welcoming and relevant, and create a sense of belonging by implementing a variety of communication tools for a variety of audiences. Park staff are working closely with the San Mateo community, with a focus on equity and inclusion, to deepen relationships, celebrate the unique landscape, and connect people to the planning efforts and action that will shape this local national park. In this project phase, the Parks Conservancy and NPS are expanding program opportunities that are welcoming, relevant, and inclusive.

Note: The engagement team acknowledges that our understanding of justice, equity, diversity, inclusion and belonging in the outdoors is constantly evolving, and the terminology used in this report is used to the best of our current knowledge. We are committed to a growth mindset and hope to incorporate changes as we continue to learn.

# **Key Findings**

The summary findings reflect key themes that the Parks Conservancy and NPS synthesized based on what was heard in conversations with community members, stakeholders, and written feedback received on the Roving Ranger engagement boards and online questionnaire.

## 1. Enhance National Park Identity

a) Share the national significance of Rancho with the community through signs and programs.

## 2. Promote A Welcoming Park Culture

- a) Increase representation of diverse communities through graphics and language.
- b) Increase community program opportunities.
- c) More staff presence.

### 3. Provide Visitor Amenities and Infrastructure

- a) Improve park entry points and parking.
- b) Increase signs for wayfinding and interpretation.
- c) Provide restrooms and seating.
- d) Improve trail connectivity within park and to adjacent communities.
- e) Ensure equitable access.

# **Next Steps**

## 1. Continuing to seek input about planning from the community:

- a) Outreach and idea generation.
- b) Diversity, equity, and inclusion.
- c) Build long-term relationships with Coastside neighbors and greater San Mateo County community members.

#### 2. Circle back and share back sessions:

- a) Reach out to existing stakeholders and new stakeholders to share what we heard.
- b) Dive deeper into ideas and feedback about the Comprehensive Site Management plan being developed, and what is next for environmental compliance, design, and construction.

# 3. Invest in the communities' ideas about how people might feel welcome on site:

a) Based on our findings from this initial phase, explore temporary signage, basic amenities such as restrooms, and increased visibility of park staff on site.

The National Park Service and the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy will continue to engage community members and groups around Rancho Corral de Tierra. We will seek input about planning at Rancho in order to create a park that is welcoming to all and communicate with neighbors and community members to inform them of park activities and park planning.
