Old Faithful Area Comprehensive Plan

Dear Friends,

Yellowstone National Park (YNP) has begun the process of developing a long range comprehensive plan for the Old Faithful developed area. This plan will focus on protecting the area's resources while responding to changing visitor and resource needs and conditions.

We invite your involvement early in this process to give you an opportunity to assist in developing the comprehensive plan. Your comments will help us protect the fundamental resources and values important to Old Faithful, one of Yellowstone's most visited treasures.

The Old Faithful Area is the premier destination in both Yellowstone National Park and the National Park Service. Recognized world-wide, Old Faithful Geyser draws people from across generations and nationalities to the park, where visitors can see hundreds of geysers and hot springs rise from the Yellowstone caldera within the Upper Geyser Basin. The Old Faithful Inn stands as a sentinel overlooking Old Faithful Geyser, an iconic partnership that exemplifies the National Park Service mission to preserve and protect natural wonders while providing for the benefit and enjoyment of visitors. The wealth of resources in this area has provided connections, both ancient and current, to human occupation and inspiration for thousands of years.

As facilities age and resources change, Yellowstone National Park seeks a plan to guide future decisions regarding preservation of park resources and enhancing visitor needs. Thank you for your participation in this effort.

What is the Purpose of the Plan?

This plan will provide a framework for future decisions that:

- Preserve important cultural and natural features and scenery within the Old Faithful developed area.
- Protect wildlife habitat and thermal systems.
- Determine ways to enhance the visitor experience at the Old Faithful Area.
- Establish desired future conditions for the visitor experience and resources within the Old Faithful Area.
- Develop guidelines to respond to changing visitor and resource needs.

Why is this Action Needed?

- Adaptation to changing thermal features: The Upper Geyser Basin is constantly changing and contains significant hydrothermal resources, which effect and are affected by nearby buildings and infrastructure.
- Circulation improvements for vehicles and pedestrians: Existing circulation systems are confusing and do not fit the needs of visitors who are on foot or are in vehicles. Both visitors and employees often have difficulty finding key features within the area.
- Visitor Experience: A high volume of visitors want to experience the geyser basin, which is open and exposed to high elevation climatic conditions where visitors often wait for 90 or more minutes between geyser eruptions. Additionally, visitors walk long distances between parking, structures, and geyser basin features.





What is the Timeline for the Old Faithful Area Comprehensive Plan/Environmental Assessment (EA)?

Project milestones include:

- Public Meetings

 - Yellowstone Association Headquarters, Park Street, Gardiner, MT, May 18, 2010, 6-8 pm
 - Visitor Contact Station, West Yellowstone, MT May 19, 2010, 6-8 pm
- Preparation of EA Summer/Fall 2010
- Public Review of EA Winter 2011
- Analysis of Public Comments Spring 2011
- Finalization of the Old Faithful Area EA, Comprehensive Plan, and expected announcement of decision – Summer 2011

Resources & Concerns

The Plan/ EA will analyze potential impacts to a number of resources, including:

- Geology, soils, and vegetation
- Wildlife and species of special concern
- Water resources, floodplains, and wetlands
- Cultural resources
- Air quality, night lighting, soundscapes
- Visitor use and experience
- Important scenic resources
- Park operations
- Public health and safety

What does the NPS wish to accomplish with this plan?

Visitor Use

- Provide the visitor with opportunities to experience and be inspired by the Old Faithful Area's resources and values
- Increase visitor understanding and appreciation of the Old Faithful Area's resources
- Improve vehicle and pedestrian circulation and parking

Public Health & Safety

- Seek to manage the Old Faithful Area for the safety of all visitors and employees
 - Reduce vehicle/pedestrian conflicts
 - Address the needs of visitors exposed to open and hot conditions and long distances

Resources

- Protect the Old Faithful Area's cultural, natural, and scenic resources, including:
 - The fragile and dynamic hydrothermal Upper Geyser Basin
 - Wildlife habitat associated with the hydrothermal areas
 - Exceptional cultural resources such as the Old Faithful Inn and the Old Faithful Historic District
 - Protect the Old Faithful Area's naturally-occurring sounds and dark night sky

Park Management/Operations

• Improve visitor services by evaluating facilities for adaptive use
