PURPOSE AND NEED FOR FEDERAL ACTION

- The federal action
 - Is to consider the Applicants' request that the National Park Service and U.S. Forest Service issue construction and right-of-way (ROW) permits
 - Is needed because the Applicants have submitted the required applications in accordance with applicable laws and NPS and USFS regulations
- In light of their missions, the National Park Service and U.S. Forest Service have a duty to consider:
 - Whether and with what conditions, if any, to issue the requested permits
 - How the requested permits would affect the resources of the national parks and forest lands
- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is a cooperating agency
 - Because of its role in evaluating permit applications for construction activities in the nation's waters, including wetlands
