THE EIS WILL EVALULATE ALTERNATIVES

The following alternatives, at a minimum, must be evaluated:

The No-Action Alternative

- For NPS Lands:
 - The National Park Service would not issue permits to cross the national park units
 - Existing power lines running through the parks would remain
 - Applicants could submit a modified permit application for consideration
- For Monongahela National Forest:
 - The U.S. Forest Service would not grant access to cross the forest
 - The Applicants could construct the transmission line outside of the forest

The Alternative Proposed by the Applicants

- Expanded ROW corridors through NPS lands
- A new ROW corridor through Monongahela National Forest
